



Bottom and Rear View of the Unit:



# **Getting Started**

#### **BATTERY BACKUP:**

A 9-Volt battery (not included) may be installed as a backup option to maintain the time if electrical power fails. In the event of a power outage, the time will not appear on the clock LCD Display, however the clock will continue to operate and the actual time will be maintained. The Clock LCD Display and other functions will resume once electrical power is restored. If used the 9-Volt battery should be replaced as needed; Remove the battery if the clock is not used or stored for long periods of time.

#### SETTING THE CLOCK TIME

Connect the AC power cord to a wall outlet. Press the STANDBY/AL-OFF BUTTON to turn off the unit first.

- 1. Press the TIME SET button to enter clock setup mode, the time display will begin to flash.
- 2. Press the F.FWD/ HOUR button to set desired hour.
- 3. Press the TIME SET button again to advance to the set MINUTES MODE.
- 4. Press the REW/ MIN button to set desired minute.

5. Press the TIME SET button to confirm the current clock setting. The time display will stop flashing.

#### SETTING THE ALARM FUNCTION

The Radio, iPod, CD or Buzzer will automatically sound at the designated time every day. You can set two different alarm times, one in AL1 and one in AL2, So that the alarm function operates twice a day.

# Wake Up to Alarm Radio, iPod, CD or Buzzer

#### FOR RADIO ALARM:

- 1. Slide the FUNCTION SWITCH to "RADIO" position.
- 2. Slide the BAND SWITCH to AM, FM-MO or FM-ST and tune in the desired station.
- 3. Adjust the volume.
- 4. Press the STANDBY/AL-OFF BUTTON to turn off the unit first.
- 5. The radio will sound at the set alarm time.

#### FOR iPod ALARM:

- 1. Slide the FUNCTION SWITCH to "iPod" position.
- 2. Insert the iPod into the the iPod Connector.
- 3. Adjust the volume.
- 4. Press the STANDBY/AL-OFF BUTTON to turn off the unit first.
- 5. The radio will sound at the set alarm time.

#### FOR CD ALARM:

1. Open the CD Door and insert a CD (with the label side facing up) into the CD compartment.

- 2. Close the CD Door.
- 3. Slide the FUNCTION SWITCH to "CD" position.
- 4. Press the STANDBY/AL-OFF BUTTON to turn off the unit first.

5. The CD will sound at the set alarm time playing the first track on the CD.

To deactivate the alarm (CD playing); Press either the STOP BUTTON or Press the STANDBY /AL-OFF BUTTON.

#### FOR BUZZER ALARM:

- 1. Press the PROG/SELECT Button. A bell symbol will light up.
- 2. Turn off the unit by pressing the POWER/AL-OFF BUTTON
- 3. The alarm buzzer will sound at the set alarm time.

Simply press STANDBY/AL-OFF BUTTON to turn off the Alarm.

**Note:** If the alarm sounds (music or buzzer) and is not stopped manually by pressing the STANDBY/AL-OFF BUTTON or SNOOZE/SLEEP button, the unit will turn off the alarm sound after 60 minutes.

#### **SNOOZE FUNCTION**

If you want to snooze a few more minutes, press the SNOOZE/SLEEP BUTTON and this will deactivate the alarm sound for 9 minutes. This can be repeated several times.

#### **SLEEP FUNCTON**

- 1. Slide the FUNCTION SWITCH to the desired music source.
- 2. Tune in the desired radio station, CD or iPod song and adjust the volume control.
- 3. Press the SLEEP/SNOOZE BUTTON. The "90" will appear on the clock display.
- 4. Repeatedly press the SLEEP BUTTON for desired sleep time between 10-90 minutes.
- 5. The unit will automatically switch off when the SLEEP time expires.
- 6. To cancel the sleep time before it expire, simply press the STANDBY /AL-OFF BUTTON to turn off or press SLEEP BUTTON repeatedly to set sleep none.

# HOW TO SET THE ALARM 1- 2 CLOCK

Press the AL1 or AL2 button to enter alarm setting mode. (When the alarm time display begins to flash and AL1 or AL2 indicator is lit up).

- 1. Press F.FWD/ HOUR button to set the desired hour.
- 2. Press REW/ MIN button to set the desired minute.
- 3. Press the PROG/SELECT Button 2 times. A musical note1/2 will light up indicating the alarm is set.

#### NOTE:

To activate the alarm 1-2 function. Please allow the display to stop flashing in the LCD Display. To deactivate the alarm 1-2 function. Press the AL1 or AL2 button again to switch off the alarm and the AL1 or AL2 indicator will go off.

# **Radio Operation**

- 1. Slide the FUNCTION SWITCH to "RADIO" position.
- 2. Slide the BAND SWITCH to the desired position (AM,FM-MO or FM-ST).
- 3. Turn on the unit by pressing the STANDBY/AL-OFF BUTTON.
- 4. Rotate the Tuning Control Knob to the desired radio station.
- 5. Adjust the VOLUME CONTROL KNOB to your preferred Listening Level.
- 6. After listening, Press the STANDBY/AL-OFF BUTTON to turn off the unit.

Note: Rotate the clock radio for better AM/FM reception.

Note: The STEREO Indicator light will turn on when a program is received in FM Stereo. If the FM reception is noisy, switch the band selector to the FM position and the program will be received in Mono radio.

# Play a Compact Disc (CD)

- 1. Open the CD Door by pressing the Open Button. Insert a CD with label side facing up into the CD compartment. Press the CD Door to close.
- 2. Slide the FUNCTION SWITCH to "CD" position.
- 3. Turn on the unit by pressing STANDBY/AL-OFF BUTTON.
- 4. The disc will rotate for a few seconds, then the disc will stop rotating and the LCD display will show the total number of tracks on the disc
- 5. Press the PLAY /PAUSE BUTTON and the first track of the CD will begin to play.
- 6. To pause the CD while in the play mode. Press the PLAY/PAUSE BUTTON. Press the PLAY/PAUSE BUTTON again to resume the play mode.

#### **REWIND/FORWARD BUTTON**

- The REW/MIN BUTTON and F.FWD/HOUR BUTTON can be used to jump to a different track number or to scan disc tracks at high speed.
- Press the REW/ MIN BUTTON once to hear the beginning of the current track on the disc (in CD play mode)
- Press the REW/MIN BUTTON twice continuously to hear the previous track on the disc (in CD play mode)
- Press the F.FWD/HOUR BUTTON once to hear the next track on the disc (in CD play mode)
- For fast forwarding or rewinding the disc, press and hold the F.FWD/HOUR BUTTON or the REW/MIN BUTTON. Release the BUTTON and normal play will resume

#### **REPEAT FUNCTIONS**

- The REP BUTTON can be used to repeat a single track, repeat all tracks and exit the REPEAT mode.
- To repeat a single track. Press the REP BUTTON once while in the play mode .The CD Repeat LCD Indicator will begin to flash.
- To repeat all of the tracks on a CD. Press the REP BUTTON a second time while in the play mode. The CD Repeat LCD Indicator will be illuminated.
- To exit the REPEAT mode. Press the REP BUTTON a third time while in the play mode, and the REP indicator light will turn off.

#### **RANDOM FUNCTIONS**

- To enter random play mode, Press the RANDOM BUTTON while in the play mode. The CD Random LCD indicator will be illuminated. (In random play mode, the unit will go back to stop mode when all the tracks have been played randomly)

- To exit the RANDOM mode. Press the RANDOM BUTTON while in the play mode, and the RAND indicator light will turn off.

#### **PROGRAM FUNCTION**

To program up to 20 tracks to play in a selected order.

- 1. While in the Stop mode only (CD is not playing).press the PROGRAM BUTTON and "P 01" will appear in the CD Track LCD Display and the Program LCD Indicator will begin to flash.
- 2. Press the REW/MIN or F.FWD/HOUR BUTTONS to select the desired track.
- 3. Press the PROGRAM BUTTON to select and store the track into memory. The next memory location (i.e. P 02.) will show in the CD Track LCD Display.
- 4. Repeat step 2 and step 3 to program 18 additional tracks.
- 5. Press the PLAY/PAUSE BUTTON to play the selected tracks in the program mode. The track number will appear in the CD Track LCD Display. The CD Program indicator will light up.
- 6. To advance to the next programmed track. Press the F.FWD/HOUR BUTTON. After all programmed tracks have played. The CD player will return to the stop mode.
- 7. To clear the program function, press STOP BUTTON to clear the previous programmed tracks.

# iPod Installation and Use

#### **Important Precaution:**

- Always use the insert that matches your iPod to avoid damage to the iPod connector pins.
- **Always** place and remove your iPod at a 15 degree angle to the rear of the unit. This allows your iPod to be inserted and removed smoothly.
- **Never** pull the iPod forward or push backwards. This can damage your Vuescape Stereo iPod Clock Radio product or your iPod.

### Installing the iPod into the Unit:

- 1. Remove the Dock Cover by pulling it up.
- 2. Select the Dock Insert that corresponds to the model of iPod to be used as labeled on the bottom of each Insert, and place it into Dock so that the label side faces down and the tabs lock into the notches in the Dock. (Refer to the Dock Insert chart in the "Parts" section to select the correct Insert.)
- Ensure that the correct Dock Insert is firmly in place, and then insert the iPod into the Dock.
   NOTE: For older iPods that do not have a Dock Connector, use a stereo audio cable (included) to connect the device to the Auxiliary Input Jack on the back of the unit (see the "Using a Non-Docking iPod or Other Audio Device" subsection)
- 4. Slide the Function Selector to iPod position.
- 5. Browse for a song on iPod, then press Play ( > II ) and enjoy!
- 6. To remove the Insert, remove the iPod and then lift the Insert from the Dock.

#### NOTE:

\*\*\*iPod classic 80GB and iPod Nano Video are compatible with the included docking insert for "iPod 20GB"

\*\*\*iPod classic 160GB is compatible with the included docking insert for "iPod Video 60GB"


\*\*\*iTouch can be connected by using the included Audio Cable.

\*\*\*Reminder...all the iPod units can be docked in this clock radio unit except the iPod Shuffle and iTouch units which can be connected by using the Audio Cable included with the Clock Radio.

### SHUFFLE FUNCTIONS

- To enter random play mode, Press the SHUFFLE BUTTON while in the play mode. The iPod shuffle indicator will be illuminated in the ipod. (In random play mode, the unit will go back to stop mode when all the tracks have been played randomly)

- To exit the shuffle mode. Press the SHUFFLE BUTTON while in the play mode, and the shuffle indicator light will turn off.



# Charging the iPod in the Unit

The unit will recharge the iPod while docked. Ensure the correct Dock Insert is used and that the IPod is properly inserted.

**NOTE**: The unit will not charge an iPod Shuffle, a non-docking iPod, or any other audio device.

### **HEADPHONE JACK**

Your radio is equipped with a HEADPHONE JACK for private listening. Simply plug any 3.5 mm plug type stereo headphone into the HEADPHONE JACK. With the headphone connected the speakers in the radio will be automatically disconnected.

### AUX INPUT JACK

- 1. Power on the unit.
- 2. Connect the AUX connection wire from the output jack of your Personal Player such as a portable MP3 player to the AUX input jack.
- 3. Slide the Function Selector to "AUX".
- 4. Press Start on your Personal Player.


